James Lancel McElhinney is a visual artist, author, public scholar, curator, publisher and oral historian. In November of 2017, he formed Needlewatcher Editions and published *Hudson Highlands*, a suite of archival prints inspired by expeditionary artists such as John-James Audubon, Joshua Rowley Watson, William Guy Wall, George Catlin and Seth Eastman. In 2018 McElhinney embarked on new explorations of the Schuylkill River, exhibiting his works in *On the Water, The Schuylkill River*, at Independence Seaport Museum in Philadelphia. Turning his attention to the Rio Grande, as it traverses southern Colorado and northern New Mexico, new works from *Grand River Sketchbook* were exhibited at Gerald Peters Gallery in Santa Fe from June 28-August 3, 2019. In September of that year, Hudson River Museum in Yonkers, NY presented the exhibition *James McElhinney: Discover the Hudson Anew*, which remains on view through February 16, 2020. McElhinney regards landscape as human desire projected upon the terrain, a palimpsest of competing visions representing a nexus of science, history and art. His artistic mission is to show how deeper personal engagement with nature can transform experience into knowledge in ways that help one develop a greater respect for nature, *leaving no trace*; to advocate for responsible environmental stewardship.
